## Board of Selectmen Report

To the citizens of our town
As we put the covid crisis further behind us, we continue to move forward to return back to the close knit community we once were. While we still have some lasting effects from the shutdown, dealing with them is continuing to be a challenge. While we work through them we are trying to fix the past and plan for the future. We are looking at replacing some of our older Highway Department equipment and get all of our trucks and equipment on a scheduled bumper to bumper inspection program by trained and certified mechanics. This will help to find potential problems before they become a more serious break down, causing us to be without a plow truck during a snow storm or when it is needed for road work. We are also looking to establish an inspection and maintenance schedule for all town owned buildings. This means we will have regularly scheduled inspections and servicing done by qualified people. They will be looking at things like the large overhead doors at the town garage and the fire department, the stand by generators at the town office and the fire station and all the H.V.A.C. systems at all the buildings. Hopefully with this new program we will get many more years out of what we have and with fewer costly breakdowns. As we move forward we ask everyone to be patient, if things don't seem to be moving as fast as you think they should be. A lot of the company's that we deal with are still short handed and dealing with supply chain problems as well. They can only do what they can do with what they have to work with. PLEASE understand we know what most of the issues are here in town and we are addressing them as fast as we can. We also want everyone to know that our select board meetings are open to the public and that we have time set aside for public discussion, so if you have an issue you feel we are not aware of PLEASE feel free to come in and bring it to our attention. Anything brought to the board will be looked in to, we might not be able to give you the answer you want but you will get an answer.

Our Public Works Dept. overcame many challenges this past winter, multiple back to back storms and freezing rain seemed to be a constant issue for them. We also had some breakdowns that caused equipment to be out of service for extended periods. We were able to get a replacement truck that got us through the winter and is still going strong for us now. We ordered a new truck and planned to put the money aside for it over a three year period. However, we got some great news, someone who ordered the same truck as we did backed out of the sale and we were offered it. We will have a brand new plow truck for this winter and we will trade in one of our older problem trucks. This will also save us money on maintenance cost whereas the new one won't need as much as the old one. This past year put many challenges in front of our highway dept. but with hard work and great leadership they overcame every one of them. They are truly extraordinary people.

Our volunteer Fire Department continues to serve our town and when asked they provide aid to the surrounding communities as well. We have recently used a grant to buy a new rescue boat and will be getting delivery of it very soon. We will also be voting to replace one of our older fire trucks that we can no longer get parts for. We would like to sell it while it still has some value for parts. Our E.M.T.'S bought new C.P.R. equipment that will allow them to train and certify other towns fire dept. and rescue personnel. We will continue to send our people to training that will prepare them for any emergency that may come their way. We would like to THANK each and every person who volunteers countless hours to be ready at a moments notice to go into harms way to save the life of someone they may not know. It takes a special kind of person to do that and I am grateful that we have people like them in our town.

The Transfer station. Thanks to our dedicated team there, is running at peak performance. We were just inspected by the state and received the best review we have ever had. GREAT JOB to all of them and keep up the great work. THANK YOU ALL

The Office Staff. Is continuing to provide the best service to this town and the people who live here. Since being hired, our town manager has worked to get up to date training that was stopped because of the pandemic. We are looking to add another member to our staff to take over the financial duties. This will help when we do the year end closings and speed up the process when the auditor comes. We hope the citizens see the wisdom in this and will support adding this position.

There are many things that take place on a daily basis that make our town the very special place that it is. We would like to THANK all our town employees, volunteers and citizens for making GREENE the best place to live and raise a family. As with all places we could always use more help, so if you could find the time we would very much appreciate anyone who could serve on a board or committee. These committees are the back bone of our community and help the select board to make the best decisions for our town. If you are interested PLEASE contact the town office for assistance. As we deal with these difficult times lets do what close knit small towns are known for, lets keep an eye out for our neighbors who may need a helping hand from time to time. ## Town Manager's Report

It is with great pleasure that I present to you the Annual Report for the town of Greene, fiscal year ending June 30, 2022. It is the purpose of the Annual Report to inform the citizens of Greene on the financial condition of the town and to report on the operational aspects as well.

It's hard to believe that I've been here for just over a year already and am approaching my second town meeting as Town Manager. Although there have been many challenges, I thoroughly enjoy my work for the town of Greene. After leaving my 20-year position as Town of Greene's Deputy Clerk in 2018, roots run deep and I am so glad to be back home serving the community that I grew up in and love.

As I began my Town Manager duties in April 2022, first on the agenda was to complete the audit for calendar year 2021. The citizens voted to go from a calendar year to a fiscal year ending in June 2022. This change was confusing for everyone, especially tax bills but now that the town is a fiscal year we coincide with the school and other towns in our district.

I continued to work with the budget system, cleaning up accounts, updating job descriptions and policies, hiring new staff and reviewing the needs of every department. As we are all well aware, the spiraling costs of everything, we were faced with challenging decisions to make while developing the budget. The Selectmen, Budget Committee and department heads are mindful of the continued financial conditions confronting all of us this year.

Of concern is the increase of the MSAD\#52 school budget which initiated a yearly payment from $\$ 4,450,242.00$ to $\$ 5,088,587.00$ which is mostly due to the decrease in State funding. This increase will be slightly offset by excise tax and other revenue sources. The town's budget before you represents an increase of $\$ 613,043$ from last year's budget reflecting additional funding for paving, purchase of a new Public Work dump/plow truck, permission to order and raise funds for a new Fire Truck with delivery in 24-36 months, hiring a Public Works Supervisor and additional funds to replace the Main Street Bridge. With these necessary capital expenses, I'm suggesting the townspeople vote to use some funds from the undesignated fund balance to offset the increase.

As mentioned previously Article 24 on this year's Annual Town Meeting Warrant requests permission to order a new Fire Truck, not to exceed $\$ 900,000.00$. Article 25 asks to raise $\$ 115,000.00$ towards the purchase of the new Fire Truck to be put into the Fire Dept Truck Capital Reserve Fund. We are proposing to use $\$ 462,931.25$ from Fire Dept Truck Capital Reserve Fund and ask for additional funds at the 2025 Annual Town Meeting, we'll have enough funds to purchase the truck without any financing.

Article 32 asks for an amount not to exceed $\$ 160,000$ to purchase the Public Works Freightliner dump/plow truck and expend $\$ 120,000$ from Public Works Equipment Capital Reserve. This truck was ordered last year and is due to be delivered November 2023. The 2011 GMC Sierra K1500 truck lost the transmission and was too costly to fix so was put up for bid. With Phil Lavoie's expertise he was able to find a replacement at a reasonable cost. The 2023 Chevy Silverado 1500 was purchased with funds from the American Rescue Plan Act. The Public Works trucks are now on a scheduled maintenance program.

The Main Street Bridge/Culvert projected cost is $\$ 875,000$. The town has been awarded a $\$ 150,000$ grant from the Department of Environmental Protection. Main Land Development Consultants have been hired to oversee the project. Article 40 asks for $\$ 350,000$ in addition to the grant to complete the project. Many thanks to Matthew Conklin for his countless hours making sure the grant application was just right.

Several committees have openings for members. The Broadband committee was created and received a $\$ 10,000$ grant to study and support efforts to make affordable, high-speed internet accessible to all Greene residents. A special thank you to Planning Board secretary, Peter Jolicoeur for his continued support. After 20 years on the Planning Board, he will be missed and we wish him good luck in his endeavors. The Comprehensive Plan committee is in need of a few more members to begin their 2 year project to define what is desired for the future of the town, to identify key issues facing the community and present actions to achieve that desired future. The Conservation Commission and Greene Village Day committees, both driven by Julia Coady are doing great things! Check out the signs and bridges on the trails at the Recreation Drive area. Greene Village Day Committee needs volunteers. This years celebration will take place in September beginning with a parade down Main Street. Several members are needed for the Parks \& Recreation committee which oversees the ballfields. If you are interested in volunteering your time on any committee, please stop at the Town Office and make out an application. The Community needs YOU!

Check out our website if you haven't done so yet. This site continues to grow with new information. Carolyn Tucker \& Matt Conklin, Website Administrators, continue to add more data which has helped cut down on the phone calls and requests for information. Don't forget to like the "Town of Greene" on Facebook to keep up to date on community events. Contact Carolyn at CarolynT@townofgreene.net to add meetings and community events to the town's calendar.

I hope this letter finds you safe and well It's an honor to continue serving as your representative in Congress, and I take the responsibility very seriously. I appreciate the opportunity to update you on what I've been working on behalf of the people of the Second Congressional District.

In August, I voted for the Inflation Reduction Act because it represented a dramatic tumaround from misguided efforts to pass sweeping, ill-designed legislation that tried to accomplish too many things through budget gimmicks, setting up problematic fiscal cliffs in numerous programs and refusing to make the difficult decisions to allow for a fiscally responsible bill

The Inflation Reduction Act, which was signed into law by the president, was fiscally responsible and targeted four key prionities: reducing our national debt and putting our country back on a more sustainable path, lowering the cost of prescription drugs, and making health care more affordable, investing in an all-of-the-above energy strategy to significantly increase oil, gas, and renewable energy production to lower energy costs for Americans, and cracking down on the tax avoidance of billion-dollar multinational corporations. This bill was the first major legislation in the last decade to use the reconciliation process to create a fiscally responsible budget to reduce deficits. The Congressional Budget Office estimated it would reduce deficits by approximately $\$ 300$ billion.

As a member of the House Armed Services Committee, I also helped pass the Fiscal Year 2023 National Defense Authorization Act, which among other things, included key wins for Bath shipbuilders, UMaine, and servicemembers and their families. For shipbuilders, the bill secured authorization for a third DDG-51 destroyer, established a new contract for up to 15 DDG-51 destroyers over the next five years, many of which will be built at Bath Iron Works; and included funding for shipyard infrastructure. The bill also authorized over \$25 million for defense research programs, including UMaine's large-scale manufacturing program Finally, the bill authonized a $4.6 \%$ pay increase to help servicemembers and their families deal with rising costs due to inflation.

Additionally, at the end of 2022, Congress passed a spending bill to fund the government through September of 2023. The bill funds nearly $\$ 27$ million in funding for community projects across the Second Congressional District, a lifeline for our lobster industry that freezes any regulatory action for at least six years, and secures millions in additional funding for the Low Income Housing Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) to help Mainers heat their homes.

Regardless of the year, one of my top prionities is ensuring I'm accessible to you. My staff and I can help answer questions about and navigate federal programs; find resources in Maine; and resolve issues with Medicare, Social Security, the VA, and other federal agencies and programs. 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## Dear Friends:

It is an honor to represent Maine in the U.S. Senate. I am grateful for the trust that Mainers have placed in me and welcome this opportunity to share some key accomplishments for our state.

Last year, I secured more than $\$ 500$ million for 285 projects from Aroostook County to York County that will promote job creation, workforce training, and economic development; expand access to health care; improve public safety, infrastructure, and community resources; and protect our environment. To address the crisis of soaring inflation and high energy prices, I led efforts to provide $\$ 2$ billion in supplemental funds to the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program. In the new Congress that begins in 2023, I expect to be the Vice Chairman of the Appropriations Committee and will continue to champion investments to support Maine's communities and families.

Strengthening our economy and supporting good jobs remain a top priority. Along with the Governor and the rest of the Maine Delegation and the associations representing the lobster industry, I worked to protect our hardworking lobstermen and women by pausing for six years the onerous federal regulations that jeopardize our lobster fishery's very existence. Another ongoing threat to Maine's small businesses is the shortage of workers. That's why I led an effort to push the Administration to nearly double the number of $\mathrm{H}-2 \mathrm{~B}$ visas that are critical to our hospitality industry. Additionally, when the Administration proposed to cut the construction of a destroyer to be built by Bath Iron Works, I restored this funding to protect Maine jobs and our national security.

When Maine Veterans' Homes announced last year that it planned to close its facilities in Caribou and Machias, I opposed that decision which would have had such a devastating effect on rural veterans and their families. I am glad that the decision was reversed, and I have secured $\$ 3$ million to help with upgrades to these facilities. My AUIO for Vets Act also became law, which will help disabled veterans maintain their independence by supporting the purchase of a new adaptive vehicle once a decade.

This past year, Congress demonstrated how effective it can be on behalf of the American people when both parties work together. A few of the bipartisan achievements that I was involved in include the Respect for Marriage Act, which will provide certainty to millions of loving couples in same-sex marriages while protecting religious liberties, and the Electoral Count Reform Act, which establishes clear guidelines for our system of certifying and counting electoral votes for President and Vice President.

No one works harder than the people of Maine, and I have honored that work ethic by showing up for every vote. During my Senate service, I have cast more than 8,500 consecutive votes, never having missed one. I remain committed to doing all that I can to address your community's concerns in 2023. Dear Friends,

I've often thought that Maine is just one big small town connected by long roads. Well, in the past year or two, those roads have gotten steeper and bumpier as we dealt with an unprecedented pandemic and the resulting economic troubles.

As we faced the historic challenges, something impressive happened. We came together and lent a hand to our neighbors wherever we could to keep things running and spirits high.

Down in Washington, Congress tried to help Maine communities get through this struggle, so that our state would come out stronger. To do that, we put in the work and set some things into motion that are already helping Maine people. That's why you hired us, after all.

The pandemic made something we'd known for a while clear: those roads and networks that connect our big town needed repair, improvements, and expansion - from bridges to broadband. So, while Maine was uniting towards a common purpose, Congress came together to pass the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law - legislation that makes generational investments in physical infrastructure, broadband connections, harbors, and the energy grid. These efforts will lay the foundation for Maine's $21^{\text {st }}$ century economy and make sure even the most rural areas aren't left behind.

Over the last two years, as we drove up and down our state, you couldn't help but see storefronts in trouble and prices rising as the economy struggled through a global recession. And again, while you focused your efforts on getting through the difficult times, Congress took meaningful action. We passed the American Rescue Plan in 2021, which enabled Governor Mills and the state of Maine to better meet the health and economic difficulties of the pandemic. At a critical moment it expanded healthcare efforts to confront COVID and invested in the state to keep the economy in far better shape than most others nationwide.

Congress didn't stop there. This year, we took even more concrete steps to cut costs, create jobs, and provide more affordable, cleaner energy. The bipartisan CHIPS Act will bring home the manufacturing of the technical components known as "chips" that are used in everything these days - from smartphones to microwaves to cars - and in doing so reduce prices and create good American jobs. We also passed the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) to lower healthcare costs, allow Medicare to negotiate drug prices, and cut energy bills with new rebates for things like heat pumps and solar panels.

Beyond these major investments, we also passed vital legislation to improve the day-to-day lives of Maine people and Americans nationwide. On a bipartisan basis, we expanded health care for veterans exposed to toxins, strengthened protections for marriage equality, supported Ukraine as it fought off a bloody Russian invasion, secured our elections and the peaceful transfer of power, and delivered millions in federal investments to projects up and down our state.

So, as Maine worked to get through hard times, Congress took steps to support our state - and we're already starting to see brighter days ahead. I'm proud to have played a small part down here; it's a true privilege to listen to you, work with you, and build a brighter future for all the incredible people up and down the roads that connect our big small town. Mary and I wish you a happy, and safe 2023.

Greetings Greene Residents,

I have heard the statistic that most Mainers live within 30 miles of where they grew up. This is certainly true for me as well as for many of you. It is a testament to what makes our state so great and how much we value our hometowns and schools.

I am the new superintendent for MSAD 52, but I am not new to the district. I taught at Leavitt Area High School from 19921999. Returning to the place where I started my career has given me so many great opportunities to see former students and learn about their post-high school lives. What I valued about the district back then remains true today. Our families work hard and value their children's education. Our kids are engaged and connected to their schools. Our staff is commitment to doing their very best for each and every student.

While there may be disagreement on some issues regarding our schools, public education in MSAD 52 is strong and getting stronger:

* When surveyed about our school climate, our families on average gave us a 3.28 out of 4 . This is a huge improvement from 3.01 in March 2022.
* Our Instructional Coaching staff in every school is supporting an increasingly large number of new and veteran teachers to ensure that we retain instructional staff so that every student has access to highly effective teachers.
* We have increased stability in leadership for our Transportation and Maintenance departments as we develop plans for future improvements and capital investments.
* We have taken significant steps to increase our financial transparency and ability to provide information to stakeholders and community members.

The challenges MSAD 52 faces are real and are not dissimilar from school districts around us. The national teacher shortage has made hiring much more difficult right here in our towns. # All first-time registrations will be processed Monday from 8:30 am to 6:45 pm Tuesday - Friday from 8:30 am to 3:45 pm 'No new registrations will be processed 15 minutes before the office closes.' 

Titles: Titles are required for vehicles 1995 and newer. Information on the back of the title must be done by the seller of the vehicle. This would include names and address of who is buying the vehicle, current mileage, and signatures of who is selling the vehicle. Mileage is required on ALL vehicles, even if the title has exempt written on it. If the odometer is broken, we need the mileage that is there, and we will address the issue at the time of registration.

Bill of Sale: Must include, date, who it is sold to, who is selling the vehicle, VIN, mileage and the amount sold for. Both buyer(s) and seller(s) must sign the bill of sale.
SR22 Insurance Filers: Please inform us of your status before we begin your registration. This applies to new and renewal registrations. We now have a phone number to call and will save you a trip to the BMV.
Transfers: You can only receive credit on a transfer if you have sold or transferred ownership of the vehicle. Please bring your old yellow registration with you to the Town Office.
Insurance Card: You must have an insurance card valid for the day you register. If you do not have a current insurance card, you can have your insurance company fax us a copy at (207) 946-2102.

Online Renewal Registration: You can renew your registration online by clicking on the Rapid Renewal icon on the Town of Greene's website. Have your current registration, mileage, and insurance card available. (new registrations can not be done through Rapid Renewal.)
Payments Accepted: Cash, checks (payable to Town of Greene), debit or credit cards. There is a $2.5 \%$ convenience fee charged by the vendor to process credit and debit card payments.

## Greene Conservation Commission Committee Report

What a wonderful year it has been. Our focus was on our continued progress of maintaining the nature trails off of Recreation Drive. We completed installation of the Greene Village Recreational Park entrance sign in the Spring of 2022 and members Julia Coady and Breanna Allard installed a flower bed garden underneath the sign to complete this project. We created a Facebook page, "Nature Trails at the Greene Recreational Park", to help facilitate information about the trails, updates and events. Members Mike Gagnon, Megan Bates, Breanna Allard and Julia Coady continued maintaining the trails and accessing areas throughout the year. They found that the two bridges located on the Red Trail system were in need of extensive repairs. These bridges were marked with caution tape and roped off until restoration can be completed. Member Julia Coady gave a presentation on the nature trails at the Sawyer Memorial and received a gracious donation from the Sawyer Foundation to benefit the committees future projects. Members of the committee concluded the year by volunteering at the Greene Village Day Celebration. Our goal now will be to continue with upgrades and maintenance projects as needed. Future projects we wish to partake in and complete are:

- Create, install and relocate a new sign at the beginning of the nature trail entrance on Recreation Drive. This will allow the public to better find the entrance to the trails and clearly mark the area. The sign will feature an updated trail map and important information pertaining to the nature trails.
- Repair the two bridges on the Red Trail system. Removing the damaged and decaying material and replacing it with new pressure treated materials.
- Working with the local Boy/Girl Scout Troops to update and repair the amphitheater area. • Work with the Julia Adams Morse Memorial Library to create an interactive "Story Walk" area on the nature trails.
- Continue crafting, painting and installing colored directional signs and update existing signs throughout the three trail systems.

A special thanks to Mike Gagnon for putting in countless hours cutting trees, blowing the trails clean and helping to maintain the area. We would like to thank the Town of Greene, Town Manger and Selectmen for their continued support with this committee.
